To Our Taxpayers:

The last few years have challenged our financial resources and last year we did not increase the budget. We continue to implement mandated increases in minimum wage, rising costs for benefits, insurance, and expenses related to the COVID Pandemic that strain our operating

About This Budget/

Based on information on the NYS Comptroller's website at the time of planning, the proposed tax appropriation for 2022 is \$2,183,334 and is within the New York State Tax Cap allowance, including a carryover of \$32,824 due to no budget increase last year.

Buildings and Grounds operations increased by \$4,000 in anticipation of increased costs for additional cleaning, supplies and PPE due to COVID. Staff and benefits increased in compliance with the next step in the NYS \$15/hr. minimum wage scale, allowing for a modest increase in the NYS health insurance, and the addition of a part-time IT person and a part-time Administrative Assistant for the business office. Programs and materials increased by \$2,000. Other income lines increased in anticipation of a return to "normal" in the coming year.

How much more will the 2022 tax appropriation cost?

According to the current Southampton Town tax-rate sheet for 2020/2021, the full market valuation of the Hampton Bays Library District was \$3,841,248,082 and the tax rate is .5404. Using this information, we estimate the 2021/22 tax rate to be .5684. A house valued at \$500,000 will pay \$284.20 next year, or \$5.47 per week - an increase of \$14.00 over last year.

The Library Director is available to answer questions about this budget on weekdays from 10 am to 5 pm. The full budget spreadsheet will be available upon request.

The Budget Hearing is on Tuesday, August 3 at 7 pm in the Library followed by the Regular Board Meeting.

Acerca de Este Presupuesto:

Según la información del sitio web del Contralor del Estado de Nueva York en el momento de la planificación, la asignación de impuestos propuesta para 2022 es de \$2,183,334 y está dentro de la asignación de límite de impuestos del estado de Nueva York, incluida una transferencia de \$32,824 debido a que no hubo aumento presupuestario el año pasado.

Las operaciones de Edificios y Terrenos aumentaron \$4,000 en previsión de mayores costos de limpieza adicional, suministros y PPE debido a COVID. El personal y los beneficios aumentaron de acuerdo con el siguiente paso en el NYS \$15/hr. escala de salario mínimo, lo que permite un modesto aumento en el seguro médico del Estado de Nueva York, y la incorporación de una persona de TI a tiempo parcial y un Asistente Administrativo a tiempo parcial para la Oficina Administrativa. Los programas y materiales aumentaron en \$2,000. Otras líneas de ingresos aumentaron en previsión de una vuelta a la "normalidad" en el próximo año.

¿Cuánto más costará la apropiación fiscal de 2022?

De acuerdo con la hoja actual de tasas impositivas de la ciudad de Southampton para 2020/2021, la valoración total del mercado del Distrito de la Biblioteca de Hampton Bays fue de \$3,841,248,082 y la tasa impositiva es de .5404. Con esta información, estimamos que la tasa impositiva 2021/22 será de .5684. Una casa valorada en \$ 500,000 pagará \$ 284.20 el próximo año, o \$ 5.47 por semana, un aumento de \$ 14.00 por año. Por ejemplo, una casa valorada en \$ ______ pagará \$ _____, un aumento de _____ respecto al año pasado.




