SEPTEMBER / OCTOBER 2021

The library's 2022 budget vote took place Tuesday, August 10, 2021. 182 people voted, with 159 voting yes, and 23 voting no. The library board of trustees and staff thank all who came out and voted. The Library staff and I look forward to providing another year of excellent service and programs to our patrons of all ages.
